Ready, Set, Go!

For a highly entertaining year theatre-wise!

A selection of plays, varied in genre has been chosen for presentation and is detailed over page.

First Up! Is an early Alan Ayckbourn play, 'Relatively Speaking' which has recently enjoyed a very well received revival in London's West End. Directed by Sharon White, an experienced St Luke's actor, the cast consists of the familiar and the new to St Luke's stage. Paul Careless is no stranger to St Luke's, having appeared mostly in the Agatha Christie's over the years. He is joined by Andrew Whitmore, last seen at St Luke's in 'Season's Greetings'. Sandra Harman, an experienced actor well known to Brisbane theatre goers, appears for the first time in a St Luke's production and Phillipa Dwyer, returning to St Luke's after a break of some years completes the cast. The play is a comedy fuelled by misunderstandings and mistaken identities with the characters thoroughly puzzled by who's who throughout. Michael Billington reviewing the London production for 'The Guardian' writes that the play is more than a comedy with the plot showing that '...prolonged misunderstanding can become a source of painful truth..' while a review by Peter Brown in the London Theatre Guide says of the 2013 production that the play is '...more than a simple comedy. Underlying the humour are issues about truth, honesty and commitment..'

'Relatively Speaking' is a very funny and enjoyable play set in the 'swinging sixties'. I am sure that audiences will get a good laugh. I leave the deeper meanings for you to unravel.

Thank you to all those who support us during the year, especially with Lesley's stall. After clearing costs the Theatre Society was able to continue to support Bunkit through World Vision at a cost of \$583 and Eamon through the Smith Family at \$516. 
Guest Directors (cont'd)

In 1976 we invited *PAT WEBSTER* to direct 'Me and My Girl' as our first attempt at a full-length musical. Pat had made a great success of this in New Guinea when Marg Doumany was teaching there and she felt sure our audiences would love it ...as indeed they did. We felt rather uncertain in the casting, needing to discover just what singing talents we had among us. It proved to be a delightful introduction to future musicals, with its well known songs and comedy storyline. Its run in London had been cut short by the 1939 World War so it was some time before it reached its full potential there. We attracted full houses and were able to take it 'on tour' many times. Pat's experienced directing had certainly convinced us that St Luke's was indeed capable of introducing such a new venture into our entertainment field. (More about all this in a future segment on musicals.) Pat moved away to the Gold Coast and was not able to work with us again unfortunately.






