

The Spotlight

The History of St Luke's – by Jan Moody OAM

Until 1989 our financial affairs, i.e. exactly where we chose to direct our funds, was our own privilege, always in accordance with our Constitution of course. New Rector, Rev. Alan Sandaver, chaired a meeting with a new financial situation put forward for our acceptance.

Until then, our priority had been to upgrade and maintain the venue, which certainly was not owned by the Theatre Society. Secondly, the aim was to support as many worthy charities, at home and abroad as reasonably possible. Excess funds, of which there was often a goodly sum in those years, were then offered to the Church to support whatever aim was on their Agenda at the time.

Apart from a holding Capital Fund of \$10,000 there was no interest in accumulating funds for any other purpose.

We accepted the new regime, which meant that the privilege to decide on the above priorities, no matter how worthy in purpose, could be adopted only after payment of a fixed sum to the Church, in consideration that we were proving to be almost permanent tenants. In other words, the Church needed to take back the right to rent its premises out to the general Community as it saw fit.

After a period of somewhat difficult adjustment, things have settled down amicably enough by means of a Parish Calendar Meeting when we are mostly given preference for our coming year's dates of occupancy. Most noticeable of course, with this sizeable committed payment from each play's profits, is the cutting back of Charity Donations. We continue our support of a World Vision child as well as a Smith Family student and with acknowledgment of the Front of House Charity Activity, run by Ros Dempsey and her worthy team.

The financially profitable Little Theatre world as we knew it in past years has changed of course with so many attractions to lure audience to fresh fields. Our formerly committed style of family entertainment is considered (by some) to be out of date. We need to be careful where we draw the line in choosing suitable plays.
